

£22 Million Bid Win for Oldham Roads

Improving Oldham's Highway Infrastructure

The highways team at Unity Partnership, Oldham, has been successful in leading a winning bid for Transport funding to reconstruct and maintain Oldham's retaining walls. With £45 million being awarded to Greater Manchester Boroughs, Oldham has been successful in attaining £22 million of this over a 3 year period. The project will play an extremely important role in improving the infrastructure of the borough, with Unity Partnership Highways playing an integral role in delivering the programme.

Gordon Anderson, Divisional Manager of Highways within Unity Partnership describes the success as "an excellent example of Unity Partnership working closely with Oldham Council and indeed the Greater Manchester authorities to bring considerable regeneration into the area". Further to this Gordon added that "the project represents a great opportunity for Unity to manage and deliver a major project for Oldham Council using its own specialist resources, augmented by resources from Government and Business Services North West and other areas of Mouchel".



With such progress being displayed through the attainment of £22 million worth of grants, it is clear to see the strength in numbers been displayed by the Partnership in Oldham.



The majority of these works will take place in Oldham's rural areas where roads located on hillsides most in need will benefit.
